Fourth-year Head Coach John Snell

Head Coach John Snell is the leader of the Baldwin-Wallace College football program.

In his first three years at his alma mater, Coach Snell has kept the Yellow Jacket program among the best in Division III and extended the school's seasonal winning streak to 38 years.

"We will work hard to help keep the B-W program one of the best in Division III," said Snell, who has an outstanding 24-8 record and .750 winning percentage after three seasons at the helm. "Our goal is to win the OAC title, keep our seasonal winning streak intact and win the NCAA Division III national title. Both our players and coaching staff are dedicated and committed to making it happen.

"I have a responsibility to keep strong the tradition of excellence of the Baldwin-Wallace College

football program," said Snell. "We are all committed to continuing that tradition of excellence and look forward to the challenges ahead."

Snell is in his 12th season at his alma mater. He has previously served as an assistant coach in charge of quarterbacks and recruiting and was the Yellow Jacket offensive coordinator for five years. In the spring of 2001, Snell was elevated to assistant head coach and offensive coordinator.

Snell was hand-picked to take over the Yellow Jacket program by Packard, who ended his career as the winningest coach in B-W history.

In his first season as the head coach of the Yellow Jackets, Snell led B-W to an impressive 8-2 overall record and a ranking in both the North Region and na-

tional in Division III polls. For his efforts, he was selected as the OAC *Co-Coach of the Year* by his peers.

Snell's program went two steps further in 2003. He led the Yellow Jackets to a 10-2 overall record and his team received B-W's first NCAA Division III Playoff berth since 1991 and won its first playoff game since 1978.

Prior to returning to his alma mater, Snell coached at the University of Rochester (1987-88 and again from 1992-94), at Rutgers University (1988-90) and the University of Buffalo (1990-92). Snell is a native of Albion, New York and graduated from Albion High School in 1983.

Snell and his wife, Shelly, reside in Strongsville and have a two-year-old son named Matthew and toddler daughter named Jamie.

Assistant Coaches

RON COSBY, JR., a native of Xenia, Ohio and most recently an assistant football coach at Cincinnati Hughes High School, has joined the Baldwin-Wallace College football coaching staff. He will coach the defensive backs and coordinate B-W's recruiting efforts with Coach Snell. Before being named to the Yellow Jacket staff, Cosby had worked previously as an assistant receiver coach (2001-2002) and assistant defensive back coach (2003) at his alma mater, Wilmington College. At Wilmington, Cosby also assisted with the offensive scout team and with kickoff and punt returners, weekly film breakdown, scouting reports, and recruiting. Cosby, a 2001 Wilmington graduate with a B.S. degree in physical education, was a four-year starter at wide receiver for the Quakers. As a senior, Cosby earned second-team All-Ohio Athletic Conference and Division III All-America honors by the USA Football All-America team. **AREA OF RESPONSIBILITY:** Defensive Backs and Recruiting Coordinator

KRIS DIAZ will be in his eighth season as the quarterbacks coach in football. Diaz, a 1978 graduate of the College, returned to his alma mater after serving as the head coach at Elyria Catholic H.S. in 1996 and 1997. Prior to being at Elyria Catholic, Diaz was the head coach at Division II Bemidji State in Minnesota from 1989-96, an assistant coach at Division II Concordia-Moorhead (Minn.) from 1983-89 and an assistant football and basketball and the head track coach at Friends University in Kansas from 1979-83. In addition to earning his undergraduate degree at B-W, Diaz has a Master's degree from the University of Akron in 1979 and a specialists degree in educational administration from Moorhead State in 1994. **AREA OF RESPONSIBILITY:** Quarterbacks

JAMIE FLEMING has rejoined the Yellow Jacket program in 2005-2006 as an assistant football coach. The 1999 graduate of the College and former football player, football student-coach and four-year wrestling letterman, will work with the Yellow Jacket running backs. Fleming comes back to B-W following a six-year stint as an assistant football coach at local Middleburg Heights Midpark H.S. He served as the offensive coordinator for two years and worked with the running backs, punters, kickers and special teams. Fleming also coordinated Midpark's Kicking Camp. He also served as an assistant wrestling coach and assistant track and field coach where he worked with the sprinters and vaulters. Fleming graduated from B-W with a Bachelor of Arts degree in physical education. While at B-W, Fleming played wide receiver. Fleming is currently a health and physical education teacher at Midpark High School. **AREA OF RESPONSIBILITY:** Running Backs

MARK HOLLARS joins the staff this fall as an assistant football coach. A veteran of the high school coaching ranks on the west side of Cleveland, Hollars will work with the Yellow Jacket offensive line. He comes to Berea following a five-year stint as the head football coach at North Olmsted H.S. He also served as the offensive coordinator and worked with the offensive line. Hollars graduated from Bowling Green State University in 1993 with a Bachelor of Science degree in education and social studies. He also minored in history and political science. Hollars began his coaching career as an assistant at Ada High School in 1990 and was promoted to offensive coordinator the following year. After graduation from BGSU in 1993, Hollars was named as the assistant head coach at Sandusky Perkins High School. He also served as the offensive coordinator and coached the quarterbacks from 1993-1994 before taking over as the head coach in 1995-1996. Hollars then moved east and was named as the head coach at Avon High School from 1997-1998. Hollars joined the collegiate coaching ranks for one season at Gettysburg (Pa.) College in 1999-2000 where he was an assistant coach and responsible for coaching the quarterbacks, field goal and point-after-touchdown units, assisted in practice and game planning, academic monitoring of players and recruiting of student-athletes. In 2000, Hollars returned to Ohio and took over the program at North Olmsted H.S.. **AREA OF RESPONSIBILITY:** Offensive Line

ADAM HOWARD is in his fourth season as an assistant coach and in his third season as the defensive coordinator. Howard was recognized for his efforts by receiving the OAC *Assistant Coach of the Year* award in 2003. A graduate of Springfield Northwestern High School in 1993, Howard received his Bachelor of Science degree from Wilmington College in 1997 and is currently pursuing his Master's degree from the University of Dayton. Prior to coming to B-W, Howard was the defensive coordinator and recruiting coordinator in football at Wilmington. He also served as the head softball coach in 2002 and as an assistant baseball coach from 1999-2001. Prior to Wilmington, Howard served as the defensive ends coach at Dayton in 1998-1999. While at Wilmington, Howard played four years of football and earned four varsity letters as a defensive back. He was a two-time All-American Mideast Conference selection and earned *Football Gazette* All-North Region honors as a senior. Howard also served as a team captain as a senior at WC. In addition to football at Wilmington, Howard ran track as a freshman and played baseball as a sophomore and earned a varsity letter in each sport. **AREA OF RESPONSIBILITY:** Defensive Coordinator

RAY HRADEK is in his second season as an assistant coach at his alma mater. The 1980 graduate and former

B-W standout coaches the wide receivers. Prior to returning to B-W, Hradek served as an assistant coach at Brunswick H.S. (2000-2003). Prior to coaching at Brunswick, Hradek was the head football coach at Middleburg Heights Midpark H.S. from 1988-99 and had a career mark of 73-47, including one state playoff appearance and two Pioneer Conference titles. Twice he was the *PC Coach of the Year*. Hradek also coached the winning west team in the 1995 Cuyahoga County East-West All-Star Game. In addition to coaching at both Brunswick and Midpark, Hradek also coached at North Olmsted H.S. (1986-87), Lakewood St. Edward H.S. (1984-85) and Mayfield H.S. (1981). He is a member and a past president of the Greater Cleveland Football Coaches Association and currently serves as the Chairman of its Scholarship Committee. While at B-W, Hradek played football and was a member of B-W's Ohio Athletic Conference championship teams of 1977 and 1978, its NCAA Division III National Championship team of 1978 and served as the team captain in 1979 when the Yellow Jackets again advanced to the Division III Playoffs. **AREA OF RESPONSIBILITY:** Wide Receivers

BOB KLINAR will be in his second season at B-W and will coach the freshmen offensive line and be the freshman offensive coordinator. He is a 1988 graduate of Mount Union College, a Master's of Art degree recipient from Miami of Ohio in 1990 and a Master's in Educational Administration from Bowling Green State University in 2001. Currently, Klinar is an assistant principal at Westlake H.S. Prior to coming to B-W, Klinar was the head football coach at Lorain Southview (1997-2000) and Lorain Catholic H.S. (1995-97) and served as an assistant coach at LaGrange Keystone H.S., Sheffield Lake Brookside H.S. and Tiffin Columbian H.S. (1987-94). Klinar was the Northeast Ohio Lakes District Coach of the Year at Lorain Catholic in 1996, the Lorain County Coach of the Year (1996) and twice served as a head coach in the Lorain County Coaches Association All-Star Game. While at Mt. Union, Klinar played tight end for the Purple Raiders from 1983-86. **AREA OF RESPONSIBILITY:** Freshman Offensive Coordinator/Freshman Offensive Line

ROY MOORE begins his 19th season on the Yellow Jackets' staff and second coaching the inside linebackers. Coach Moore, who is the senior member of the staff, previously coached the outside linebackers for 16 years. He is a 1972 graduate and football letterman at B-W. He received his Master's degree from B-W in 1993. Moore coached for 12 years at Midpark High School in the football, basketball and track programs. His last six years at Midpark, Moore served as defensive coordinator. Moore is a computer science teacher and curriculum coordinator at Berea High School. **AREA OF RESPONSIBILITY:** Linebackers

GUS PATOUHAS is in his 12th season of assisting with the Yellow Jacket program and his fourth as defensive ends coach. Patouhas, a 1993 graduate of the College, was a three-year starter and mainstay for the Yellow Jackets as a player. He earned *Football Gazette* NCAA Division III All-American honors and was B-W's Dick Van Almen Award winner in 1992. In 2002, Patouhas was inducted into the LaGrange Keystone H.S. Athletic Hall of Fame. In addition, Patouhas was an Academic All-OAC selection at B-W. In 2002, he graduated with honors with a Master's of Education degree from Cleveland State University. He currently teaches physical education at Riverside Elementary School in Berea. **AREA OF RESPONSIBILITY:** Defensive Line

MIKE SMITH starts his 15th season as a member of the Yellow Jacket staff. Smith coaches the running backs. Smith is a 1979 graduate of Miami (Ohio) University. Following graduation, Smith served as a coach at the high school level and at Oberlin College. In 1990, Smith served as a graduate assistant coach under Gary Moeller at the University of Michigan. Since 1985, Smith has served as an offensive line coach at the University of Michigan's summer technique camp. **AREA OF RESPONSIBILITY:** Tight Ends

RON SKELLEY, a 1971 graduate of the College, is in his second season at B-W and will work with the freshman linebackers and is the freshman team defensive coordinator. He received his Master's Degree in Education from B-W in 1982. In addition, Skelley was the head football coach at Parma Senior H.S. from 1993-2003 and the head football coach at Parma Normandy H.S. from 1987-1993. In addition to his coaching duties, he is a social studies teacher at Parma H.S. and was the 1986 Parma Public Schools and Ohio House of Representatives Outstanding Teacher. **AREA OF RESPONSIBILITY:** Freshman Defensive Coordinator

MARCELLO VELASQUEZ, a 2004 B-W graduate and former player, joins the program and will assist Gus Patouhas and work with the Yellow Jacket defensive line and assist Head Coach John Snell in a number of other parts of the program. He graduated with a Bachelor of Arts degree in sport medicine and fitness management. He was a four-year member of the Yellow Jacket football team and earned a varsity letter as a defensive tackle. As a senior, Velasquez helped the Yellow Jackets to finish with a 10-2 record and advance to the second round of the NCAA Division III National Playoffs. In addition to assisting defensive line coach Gus Patouhas, Velasquez will be responsible for the football computer program and system, input and analysis, helping with recruiting and monitoring the academic progress of Yellow Jacket football student-athletes. **AREA OF RESPONSIBILITY:** Assist with the Defensive Line, Film Input and Analysis, Recruiting and Monitoring Academic Progress

The Yellow Jackets Look to Challenge

BEREA, OHIO -- The 2005 Baldwin-Wallace College football team will seek to challenge for the prestigious Ohio Athletic Conference title and have its 39th straight winning season.

"Our goals remain the same," said fourth-year Head Coach John Snell, 24-8 in his first three years at his alma mater. "Each year, we make winning the OAC title our top priority. We know that if we win the OAC title that we have the ability to win a Division III national title."

The Yellow Jacket defense should be solid and hopes are that both of its returning quarterbacks will be

team All-OAC end Ryan Lewis returns to lead the way. Lewis has 109 career tackles and 16 QB sacks. In addition, juniors Sam Rantucci (34 tackles/ 3 sacks), Derek Fabry (22 tackles/ 4.5 sacks) and Matt Leber (22 tackles/ six sacks) return.

"Our defensive line was strong last year and we expect them to be a strength for us again this year," said Defensive Coordinator Adam Howard, the 2003 OAC Assistant Coach of the Year. "Ryan Lewis has been one of the top linemen in the OAC the past two years and we expect him to anchor the line this year."

Senior two-time All-OAC outside linebacker Justin Princehorn was a first-team All-OAC pick and has 183 career stops and senior inside linebacker Joe George was a second-team All-OAC choice and has 223 career tackles. They are two of the top returning linebackers in the North Region. In addition, look for senior Matt Martig (30 stops in seven games), junior Dave Brown (23 tackles) and sophomore Nick Schubert (13 tackles) all to be factors.

"Justin Pricehorn and Joe George are two outstanding linebackers," said Howard. "We look for them to both lead by example. Justin makes plays all over the field and Joe is a mainstay in the middle. In addition, we have three other returning linebackers who we feel are also very good."

In the secondary, junior Jake Knipp is back to lead the way after making 47 tackles a year ago. Look for senior Mike Finamore and juniors Pat Birch and Matt

better.

"We look for our defense to again be solid," said Snell. "Return a number of veterans and starters as well as a number of other young men who saw plenty of playing time a year ago."

"Offensively, we know that we need to be balanced between the run and the pass and we need to score points," said Snell, who also serves as the Offensive Coordinator. "We return a pair of experienced quarterbacks, a runner who had more than 1,100 yards last year and three experienced receivers. On the line, we also return a number of young men who gained valuable experience in 2004."

"Our special teams will be led by All-American punter Kevin Soflkiancs and we need to identify a placekicker," said Snell. "We also got solid return production from Brad Rhoden."

Overall, B-W returns 15 starters, including seven on offense and seven on defense and an All-American punter, and 31 total lettermen. In addition to the returning starters, many of the returning lettermen either started or saw significant playing time a year ago.

On defense, B-W returns five key linemen, five of six linebackers and a bevy of young and talented deep backs.

On the defensive line, senior two-time second-

The defense is aided by the return of first-team All-OAC, first-team All-North Region and first-team Division III All-American punter Kevin Soflkiancs. A year ago, Soflkiancs led all of Division III with a 42.7-

yard average.

Offensively, juniors Mike DiAngelo and Rob Lewis will battle for the starting job. DiAngelo completed 105-of-203 passes for 1,249 yards with eight touchdowns and nine interceptions. He also ran for 68 yards and two more scores. Lewis ran for 123 yards and one TD and completed 23-of-54 aerials for 247 yards. They will compete with sophomore Mickey Mental, who made good progress a year ago on the junior varsity team.

"Both Mike and Rob had success a year ago at times and we will be looking for them to be more consistent this year," said Snell. "Mike is more of a drop back passer with a strong arm, and Rob gives us the ability to run an option-style offense. Both have the ability to lead this team.

"The staff also is confident in the growth and maturity of Mickey," said Snell. "It will make for an interesting battle in preseason camp."

The feature back is returning first-team All-OAC pick Brandon Hedges who ran for 1,162 yards in school-record 225 attempts with 13 TD a year ago. Hedges also caught 23 passes for 152 yards. Also look for senior Academic All-OAC fullback Bryan Pickens to run, catch and block effectively again. A year ago, Pickens ran for 52 yards in 13 attempts and caught 10 passes for 81 yards and a TD.

"Brandon Hedges returns as the top runner in the OAC after the season he had in 2004," said Snell. "Brandon possesses the ability to both run hard between the tackles and with the breakaway speed to outrun the defense. Brandon will be a key to our offense.

"Bryan is one of our hardest workers and strongest leaders," said Snell. "He will do anything that is asked of him to help the team."

DiAngelo and Lewis have a pair of experienced wide receivers back in senior David Peterson and Tom Murphy. Peterson caught 17 passes for 166 yards and Murphy grabbed 10 aerials for 175 yards. In addition, senior tight end Mike Brosovich (16 rec. for 292 with 3 TD). Brosovich missed all of last last year due to injury but returns healthy this year and should make a difference.

"Both David and Tom have each seen playing time the past two years and are solid receivers," said Snell. "Each has good hands, runs disciplined pass routes and is an asset to our offense.

"Getting Mike Brosovich back is a big plus," said Snell. "Mike can help both in the running and passing game. He is a big, strong young man who has good hands and can break tackles once he catches the ball."

On the offensive line, second-team All-OAC and Academic All-OAC junior guard Tom Lutz headlines a group of three returning starters. The others are junior tackles Eric Foisel and Adam Laurell and senior Aca-

ademic All-OAC (2003) center Marc Zaranec. two years ago, Zaranec moved from defensive to offense. Now, he moves from guard to center and follows in the footsteps of Academic All-Americans Matt Kish '03 (2002 and 2003) and Tom Kovacevich '05 (2004).

"Tom Lutz showed last fall that he has the ability to be one of the top linemen in the OAC this year," said Snell. "In addition Adam Laurell and Eric Foisel return as starters, we get Marc Zaranec back and he moves to center and there are a number of other returnees who saw playing time last fall."

On special teams and in addition to Soflkiancs, look for sophomore return specialist Brad Rhoden to be a key return man and play CB. He returned 13 punts for a 15.0-yard average and 13 kickoffs for a 19.5-yard

Running Back Brandon Hedges Seeks to Join the Elite

BEREA, OHIO -- Baldwin-Wallace College junior running back Brandon Hedges (Oregon Clay) will seek to join the elite of Yellow Jacket running backs this fall. If Hedges makes as much progress this year as he has in his first two seasons in Berea, this could be an exceptional year.

A year ago, Hedges ran for 1,162 yards in a school single-season record 225 attempts and scored 13

touchdowns. His 1,162 yards gained was the seventh highest total by a Yellow Jacket runner and his 13TD tied for fourth best in a single campaign. He was a first-team All-OAC selection and among the top runners in the North Region of Division III.

"Brandon is an outstanding runner who continues to get better all the time," said Head Coach John Snell. "He sees the field well and can both run hard and be elusive.

He also has the speed to take the ball all of the way to the endzone."

This year, Hedges will seek to join an elite group of runners who have eclipsed the 2,000-yard plateau. But his career did not start that way.

As a freshman, Hedges saw action on the junior varsity team and played in one varsity game, rushing three times for 14 yards.

Baldwin-Wallace College Student-Athletes Will Benefit From an Expanded, Renovated and State-of-the-Art Rec Center

BEREA, OHIO -- The Baldwin-Wallace College student and athlete will benefit later this fall when the expansion and renovation of the Recreation Center is complete.

The building will now be called the Lou Higgins Center. Through a gift from the Higgins family all students at B-W will benefit in many ways, including members of the football program.

Growth in popularity of education programs in the building including athletic training education, sport management and others require the addition of office space for faculty and coaches.

B-W broke ground in June 2004 to expand and renovate its physical education and recreation facilities. The \$5 million project, which features the addition of 19,000 square feet and renovation of more than 14,000 square feet will help the College accommodate expanding academic program, athletic and recreation needs.

"The expansion and renovation of the Lou Higgins Center will offer the B-W football student-athlete the opportunity to train and condition in the best possible environment," said Head Coach John Snell. "The facility will be utilized a great deal by our football student-athletes and it is just another example of the outstanding commitment the College

has made to help our athletic and recreation programs."

Here is a breakdown of what has been added to the facility that now has more than 170,000 square feet and is located on Bagley Road in Berea and directly across the street from The George Finnie Stadium.

The New Fitness Space

- * Created a new aerobics/ group exercise room.
- * Doubled the size of the existing weight room. This will give both student-athletes and non-student-athletes each the opportunity to work out simultaneously.
- * Expanded the existing fitness center.
- * Expanded fitness equipment holdings. A number of new machines were added to the stock.
- * Added convenience lockers for students.

The Classroom and Laboratory Space

- * Create a new training suite for the Athletic Training academic program which has grown markedly in the past decade.
- * Expand the Exercise Physiology Laboratory.
- * Add two new classrooms.

Office Space

- * Added 17 new spaces for faculty and coaches. This will help to facilitate meetings and more personal attention to both students and athletes.
- * Renovated 18 existing faculty and coach offices which will add to greater efficiency and a better working environment.

Common Spaces

- * Renovated the Tressel Lounge.
- * Expanded the west side entryway to improve building access and equipment check.
- * Renovated the existing lobby.
- * Renovated the athletic archive area in the front of the building.
- * Improved acoustics in the facility.

Storage Space

- * Added storage space to the academic, sports and recreation programs.

The project is expected to be completed in the Fall of 2005 and is designed to accommodate future growth in the academic, athletic and recreation programs at the College.

Soflkiancs Named to Street & Smith's Preseason All-America and the Gilburg Division III Punter of the Year "Watch List"

BEREA, OHIO -- Baldwin-Wallace College sophomore punter **Kevin Soflkiancs (Middleburg Heights/ Midpark High School)**, who led the Ohio Athletic Conference and all of NCAA Division III in punting as a freshman, has been named to the "Watch List" for the annual Tom Gilburg Division III Punter of the Year Award. **Soflkiancs** is one of five players named to the preseason list.

Earlier this summer, **Soflkiancs** was named as a first-team Division III preseason All-American in the *Street & Smith's College Football 2005 Yearbook*. The Yearbook went on sale on June 14.

As a freshman, **Soflkiancs** averaged 42.7 yards per punt in 55 attempts, including 20 that landed inside the opponent's 20-yard line. He had a season-long punt of 70 yards. He was a first-team All-OAC,

first-team All-North Region and first-team All-American as selected by both *The Football Gazette* and Division III SID all-america teams.

In addition to being an outstanding football student-athlete, **Soflkiancs** is a fine student who carries a 3.5 grade point average and will be a candidate for ESPN THE MAGAZINE College Division Academic All-America accolades this fall.

Senior Linebackers Justin Pricehorn and Joe George Excel on the Field and in the Classroom as Exceptional Leaders

BEREA, OHIO -- Baldwin-Wallace College senior student-athletes and linebackers **Justin Pricehorn (Massillon/ Washington)** and **Joe George (Massillon/ Perry)** have a lot in common and will lead the Yellow Jacket charge on defense in 2005.

Both **Pricehorn** and **George** are from Massillon. Both are outstanding students and football players and are among the top returning linebackers in the North Region of Division III. Each also has been named as B-W's Outstanding Linebacker.

Pricehorn returns as a two-time All-Ohio Athletic Conference pick, including being a first-team selection in 2004. The 3.2 student in information systems and technology who was B-W's Most Outstanding Linebacker also was an

Academic All-OAC pick a year ago when he finished second on the team with 72 total tackles, including a team-leading 35 solo stops. He enters his senior season with 183 career tackles and as a three-year starter. As a sophomore, **Pricehorn** led the Yellow Jackets with 104 tackles and became just one of 12 players in school history to have 100 or more tackles in a single season.

George, who has started at inside linebacker since the second game of his freshman season, was a second-team All-OAC, Academic All-OAC and *ESPN THE MAGAZINE* Academic All-District player in '04. As a junior, **George** topped the team with 87 total tackles, including a team-leading 53 assists, and currently ranks sixth all-time in school history with 223 career tackles. As a sophomore, George

had 102 tackles and was B-W's Most Outstanding Linebacker. The pre-med major carries a 3.5 grade point average and is a member of the Pre-Med Club, Alpha Lambda Honor Society and the Omicron Delta kappa honorary.

"Both **Justin** and **Joe** have made a significant impact in our program since their freshman year," said fourth-year Head Coach John Snell.

"**Justin** is a vocal leader who is quick and strong and uses his intelligence to make a lot of big plays," said Snell. "**Joe** is a leader by example who also uses his strength, toughness and intelligence to benefit our defense. We are very lucky to have two outstanding young men and leaders like **Justin** and **Joe**."

A Tradition of Academic and Athletic Excellence; B-W has produced 20 Academic All-Americans in football since 1972

BEREA, OHIO -- The Baldwin-Wallace College football program has a tradition of producing outstanding football teams and outstanding student-athletes.

During the 30 years that CoSIDA (College Sports Information Directors of America) have chosen a College Division Academic All-America team, B-W has produced 21 Academic All-Americans in football, including 2005 graduate and third-team pick Tom Kovacevich. Kovacevich carried a 3.8 grade point average with a triple major. Three years ago, Matt Kish '03 was a first-team Academic All-America pick for the second straight year and won the Milton T. Baldwin Prize at graduation as the

senior with the highest grade point average.

Overall, the total B-W athletic program has produced 59 Academic All-Americans in the last 21 years -- more than any other OAC school.

In the past three years, B-W has had 27 student-athletes named Academic All-OAC and 14 more tabbed as CoSIDA Academic All-District IV selections.

This year, B-W begins the fall with 45 football student-athletes with a 3.0 or better grade point average, including six returning Academic All-OAC players. They are senior inside linebacker **Joe George (Massillon/ Perry)**, junior running back **Brandon Hedges (Oregon/ Clay)**, junior offensive guard

Tom Lutz (Oregon/ Clay), senior fullback **Bryan Pickens (New London/ Norwalk St. Paul)**, senior outside linebacker **Justin Princehorn (Massillon/ Washington)** and senior offensive guard **Mark Zaranec (Bedford/ St. Peter Chanel)**.

Baldwin-Wallace Looking For 39th Consecutive Winning Season

For the past 38 years, the Baldwin-Wallace College football program has produced a winning record. The active seasonal winning streak is the second longest in all of college football with only defending NCAA Division III national champion Linfield College of Oregon having a longer streak. Hopes are high in Berea that B-W can again have a winning mark in 2005.

During "The Streak," B-W has compiled a 271-82-5 overall won-loss-tie record with an impressive .764 winning percentage. The Yellow Jackets have made six trips to the Division III National Playoffs, and won the Division III National title in 1978 when they defeated then Ohio Athletic Conference foe Wittenberg University, 24-10.

Three head coaches have led the Yellow Jackets during "The Streak."

The late and legendary Lee Tressel mentored B-W from the beginning of "The Streak" in 1967 until his retirement in 1980. Tressel had a 155-52-6 mark and .742 winning percentage. Newly retired head coach Bob Packard produced a 156-54-2 mark and a .741 winning percentage since 1981. Current coach John Snell is 24-8 (.750) after three seasons at his alma mater.

B-W's best season during "The Streak" was its national championship year of 1978 when the Yellow Jackets were 11-0-1 overall. B-W had two other undefeated regular season records, in 1982 and 1991.

Twice during "The Streak," B-W had to win its final four games of the year to preserve the feat.

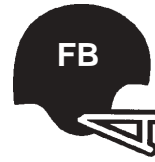

The Baldwin-Wallace College Football student-athlete is one of the best publicized in all of small college and NCAA Division III athletics. Several factors help this to happen.

Its location, its national and conference affiliation and philosophy of athletics, its administration and coaches and its support of the student-athlete all play large roles in telling others about B-W and the successes of its student-athletes.

Baldwin-Wallace College is a small, private, liberal arts college located 12 miles southwest of Cleveland, Ohio. While being in the small and pro-gressive local community of Berea, B-W student-athletes benefit from being close to a major urban area such as Greater Cleveland/Akron. B-W athletics receive support both in Cleveland and Akron and in the Berea community itself.

Being a member of the prestigious Ohio Athletic Conference and playing NCAA Division III athletics also is an advantage. Coaches who are teachers first forge a solid commitment to the Division III philosophy of the student-athlete.

Baldwin-Wallace also is proud of its athletic heritage and the fact that it has produced 59 College Division Academic All-Americans since 1970, including three in 2004-2005. In football, the Yellow Jacket program has produced 21 Academic All-American student-athletes since 1970, including 2005 graduate and offensive center Tom Kovacevich.

Support in terms of facilities, equipment and transportation and in staff provides the Baldwin-Wallace student-athlete with a luxury not enjoyed at many other schools. One part of that support is in the area of sports information.

A diligent staff of B-W sport information student assistants and sport management majors work with the director to publicize B-W and its coaches and student-athletes in 20 NCAA Division III sports.

The students learn first-hand about publicizing a program by updating the internet website, writing hometown press releases and doing feature stories, doing game and cumulative statistics as well as statistical analysis, game and special event programs, Web-based and media guides, contacting

local, state and national media sources prior to and after each game and promoting and administering special events during athletic contests.

Each Yellow Jacket Football student-athlete receives at least one hometown press release which is sent to the individual student-athlete newspaper list. When the student-athletes fill out a preseason questionnaire, each is asked to list his or her hometown newspaper.

After each football game, the internet website is updated, a FAX is sent to B-W's base of local, state and national media that regularly cover or have requested B-W coverage. In addition, hometown facsimile messages about individual performances are also sent either the date of the contest, the next day and during the week preceding the next game. Statistics are also updated and made available to all requesting the information.

Campus radio station WBWC, 88.3 FM, broadcasts all home and away football and basketball games as well as covering all other Yellow Jacket sporting events, press conferences or announcements on a selected basis. ***You can also access the Yellow Jacket home and away football games via the Internet Website at www.bw.edu/athletics.*** A number of former B-W student broadcasters have gone to successful careers in the Greater Cleveland area, both in radio and in television. In addition, the four local commercial television stations and numerous radio stations do game coverage and feature interviews on a selected basis.

The Baldwin-Wallace College fall sport student-athlete receives excellent local small college coverage both in terms of game coverage and hometown coverage by *The Plain Dealer* (Cleveland's major daily with a circulation of more than 500,000 homes), the *Chronicle-Telegram* (based in Elyria, Ohio), the *Morning Journal* (based in Lorain, Ohio), the *Beacon-Journal* (based in Akron, Ohio), the *Medina County Gazette* (based in Medina, Ohio), the *Sun Newspapers* (Cleveland's largest weekly newspaper serving the Greater Cleveland area) and a number of other daily and weekly publications in Northeast Ohio.

The sports information office at B-W offers the student-athlete the opportunity to receive maximum exposure at the small college level. In addition, the B-W sports information student assistant garners solid skills in writing, communications, advertising, marketing, promotion, Web site and publication layout and design and sport and event management. Overall, 21 former Yellow Jacket SID student assistants have gone on to sports information, marketing, promotion and/or management careers in the college and professional ranks with the Kansas City Chiefs (NFL), the Cleveland Force (MISL), the Toledo Mudhens (minor league baseball), Host Communications, Turner Sports in Atlanta, the Raycom Sports Network, the University of Texas at Austin, Notre Dame (Ind.), Arizona State University, the University of Nebraska, the University of Arkansas, Kent State University, Monmouth (N.J.), the University of Florida, Eastern Michigan University, Youngstown State University, the Ohio Athletic Conference, Hiram College, Heidelberg College and Olivet (Mich.) College.

The Yellow Jacket Athletic Facilities Are Among the Best in NCAA Division III Athletics

The Baldwin-Wallace College football student-athlete is afforded the opportunity to learn, exercise, practice and play in some of the finest facilities in small college athletics. In addition, as a student at B-W, each has an opportunity to use a group of facilities that are unparalleled in Division III athletics.

The expanded and newly renovated Lou Higgins Center with the Ursprung Gymnasium, Harrison Dillard Track and Natatorium, The George Finnie Stadium with an additional grass field adjacent to it and behind Bagley Hall (the old Cleveland Browns Training Facility), the Heritage Field for baseball, the "Pop" Collins Tennis Complex and other outdoor recreation and athletic areas at Baldwin-Wallace make the Yellow Jackets physical plant second to none among small colleges.

The Lou Higgins Center, dedicated on October 18, 1986, is a facility that benefits all B-W students, faculty, staff and alumni and is considered one of the top recreation facilities in the country.

The 170,000 square foot Rec Center serves as home for the health and physical education departments, all winter intercollegiate and intramural sports, as well as playing host for a number of amateur sporting events.

The Rec Center, which includes the Rudolph S. Ursprung Gymnasium, serves as the home of Yellow Jackets basketball, volleyball and wrestling teams. Ursprung Gymnasium, which has housed B-W basketball since 1949, received a complete renovation in 1986 and was renovated again this summer. In addition to B-W playing in the Ursprung Gym, the Ohio High School Athletic Association has long used the B-W facility for its sectional and district tournaments for boys.

The fieldhouse consists of a 200-meter, six-lane track that is named for 1949 B-W graduate and four-time Olympic gold medalist Harrison Dillard. The track, with its Mondo surface, is both fast and comfortable for the walker, jogger or serious runner. Pits for the field events are also incorporated. The track surrounds three multi-purpose courts that can be used individually or in tandem for volleyball, basketball, tennis and other activities. On many occasions, the B-W basketball team has been playing a game while a wrestling match or an intramural basketball game was taking place in the Rec Center fieldhouse.

The Harrison Dillard Track, along with the multi-purpose courts, have been home for the B-W indoor track teams, the John Summa Invitational Wrestling Tournament, the Ohio Sports Festival (basketball and wrestling venues) and many local high school track meets.

Also in the Rec Center is the B-W Natatorium, home to the Yellow Jacket swimming and diving teams. The facility includes a 25-yard, six-lane pool with a one-meter diving board. The movable pool bottom has adaptive physical therapy applications and can be used by the disabled.

As part of the renovation of Ursprung in 1986, chairback seating and a media center were constructed while training and physical therapy, laundry and eight locker rooms were added. Other features include a room for news media as well as exhibit and storage areas for the B-W Athletic Archives.

The Archives give students, alumni, parents, friends and visitors to Baldwin-Wallace a glimpse of the rich tradition and heritage of Yellow Jacket teams and athletic greats.

The George Finnie Stadium is one of the nations best small college stadiums for football and track and field. The Yellow Jacket men's and women's soccer teams also play at Finnie and numerous Ohio High School Athletic Association State Playoff games have been held at Finnie in addition to an Ohio State University Scarlet & White Spring Game and a few Cleveland Browns and Pittsburgh Steeler Alumni contests.

In terms of track and field, B-W has already hosted five NCAA Division III national championship track meets, a Pan-American Games qualifying meet, a number of high school sectional and district track meets and is the home field to both Berea High School and Middleburg Heights Midpark High School. The Ohio Sports Festival/Ohio State Games also used Finnie as both a regional and state championship site.

The B-W Baseball Field is located on the campus within walking distance of the student dormitories. The facility has a manicured playing surface and seating for approximately 200 fans. The B-W Baseball Field has been the host site for four OAC Baseball Tournaments and is home to the nationally-ranked Yellow Jacket baseball squad.

The "Pop" Collins Tennis complex is named in honor of former B-W tennis coach and teacher Arthur Worth Collins, the father of nationally renowned sportswriter and television tennis analyst Arthur "Bud" Collins '51. The facility is on campus and includes six courts which are lighted for night play.

In addition, the Yellow Jacket softball team plays at the Cuyahoga County Fairgrounds Field. The facility has dugouts, a permanent fence and scoreboard and is one of the best softball facilities in the OAC.

Does such a strong group of facilities benefit the Yellow Jacket football? Definitely! Practice time is available in the Finnie Stadium the week of a game on turf, on the grass field adjacent to Finnie Stadium on the week of a game on grass and in the Lou Higgins Center during times of inclement weather.

In addition, B-W has always had a close working relationship with the National Football League's Cleveland Browns. At one time, the Browns had their main offices located on the B-W campus. That building is now known as Bagley Hall. The grass practice field behind Bagley Hall is the same one of the Browns used for many years.

The Browns have since moved to their current location on Lou Groza Blvd. and are just two blocks from campus. At times of inclement weather, B-W has occasionally been able to use the Browns indoor practice facility.

"Finnie Stadium, the Lou Higgins Center and the possibility of using the Cleveland Browns practice facility are a plus to our program," says Head Coach John Snell. "The playing, practice and dress facilities that our football student-athletes are afforded are among the finest in all of college athletics and especially in Division III."
